In this year of Mercy, our Pilgrimage will be held on September 10, 2016 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC. The Pilgrimage Mass will be celebrated in English by the Most Rev. Mario Eduardo Dorsonville-Rodriguez, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC.

Every year we gather at the Basilica to show our love and devotion for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and His mother Mary. This beautiful and solemn event starts with recitation of the rosary, litany, procession, and culminates with Holy Mass and blessing of the children. Priests will be available to hear confession before the rosary, for those interested. Every year the Pilgrimage attracts devotees from various parts of the country, especially the East Coast. This is significant evidence of our Mother's healing power and the success of IACA's activities and increased visibility over the past 23 years.

IACA is an umbrella organization representing Catholic communities from India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka and its main mission is to help South Asian Catholics to come together to share their common spiritual heritage and to pray to Our Lady of Good Health, Vailankanni to intercede for their needs. This year the Pilgrimage is more meaningful for us because our own Blessed Mother Teresa will be canonized in Rome on September 4, 2016, and the order she founded in Calcutta, the Missionaries of Charity will be recognized for the great humanitarian work they do all over the world.

Through our Blessed Mother's intercession, IACA had an outstanding year since the 2015 Pilgrimage and we look forward to continuing the momentum on the progress we have made so far, for which we ask your support. IACA is a Washington, DC-based organization that is operated solely through the services of volunteers. Any and all costs of activities are supported solely through the generous contributions from our well-wishers. I thank you for your generous support and for making IACA a special family of faith and ask you to make this year's Annual Pilgrimage a memorable one with your presence. God Bless you all.

Mario Eduardo Dorsonville-Rodríguez was born in Bogotá, Colombia to Carlos and Leonor (Rodríguez) Dorsonville. He studied for the priesthood at the major seminary of the <u>Archdiocese of Bogotá</u> where he received a bachelor's degrees in philosophy (1981) and sacred theology (1985). He was ordained a priest for the Bogotá archdiocese on November 23, 1985. While studying at Catholic University he served as curate at Good Shepherd and Christ the Redeemer parishes in the Diocese of Arlington in Virginia (1992-1994), and as a lecturer at the Inter-American Development Bank in Washington. At the same time he also served as a professor at the Hispanic Apostolate of Arlington from 1993 to 1994. After he returned to

Colombia, Dorsonville served as chaplain and professor of ethics at the National University of Colombia and professor of pastoral counseling and catechesis at the major seminary of the Archdiocese of Bogotá (1995-1996). He returned to the United States where he served as curate at St. Joseph parish in Arlington, Virginia in 1996.

Dorsonville was named titular Bishop of Kearney and an auxiliary bishop for Washington by Pope Francis on March 20, 2015. His episcopal consecration took place on April 20, 2015 at the Cathedral of St. Matthew in Washington, D.C. He was consecrated by Cardinal Donald Wuerl of Washington DC.

#### **Major Activities of IACA - 2016**

IACA is a non-profit charitable organization registered in the Nation's capital supporting religious and charitable causes important to our communities. During the past year IACA was actively involved in the following events:

- 1. <u>Divine Mercy Lenten Retreat</u> IACA helped organize and promote the Retreat by Bro. Mathew Joseph in March 2016 in Alexandria, VA. Bro. Mathew is a charismatic preacher based in Houston, TX and the founder of REACH OUT TO ALL (ROTA), a Catholic Charismatic Ministry. Bro. Mathew grew up in Calcutta, India and was influenced by Blessed Mother Teresa, who was very close to the Joseph family from the beginning of her mission. Blessed Mother Teresa started one of her first schools for slum children in the compound of the Joseph home in Calcutta and was the main inspiration for Bro. Mathew to start this ministry to reach out to souls for Jesus.
- 2. <u>Luncheon Discussion</u> In April 2016 Archbishop Emeritus Vincent Concessao of New Delhi, an outspoken leader of our Catholic faith, came to the DC Metropolitan area with a number of other Christian leaders from India as part of a United Prayer Movement for India. He is the Vice President of the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI) and the former Director of Social Action of the Archdiocese of Delhi. While in Washington, he celebrated Holy Mass and IACA organized a luncheon reception after Mass. At the reception he shared his experiences and discussed the challenges faced by Christians in India in the past few years. It was an eye opening experience.
- 3. <u>Asian & Pacific Island Pilgrimage</u> IACA actively participated and helped organize the 14<sup>th</sup> annual Asian and Pacific Island Catholic Pilgrimage on May 7, 2016 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. This large, multi-cultural religious celebration had representatives from almost all Asian and Pacific Island Catholic communities including Bangladeshi, Burmese, Cambodian, Chinese, Filipino, Indian, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Laotian, Lebanese, Montagnard, Pakistani, Samoan, Sri Lankan, Thai, and Vietnamese. The main celebrant for Holy Mass was Archbishop Bernardito C. Auza, Vatican Representative to the United Nations; he was assisted by over 25 priests from the various Asian countries.
- 4. Mothers' Day Pilgrimage IACA organized the annual Mothers' Day Pilgrimage on May 15, 2016 at St. Mary's Chapel, at the shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in Emmitsburg, MD. The Holy Mass celebrated by Rev. Fr. Anthony Dhas in honor of our Mothers was followed by rosary in the Grotto, and then a luncheon picnic at the nearby Cunningham Falls State Park. Next year, the Mothers' Day Pilgrimage is tentatively scheduled for May 21, 2017.
- 5. <u>Hindu-Catholic Dialogue</u> IACA supported the second Hindu-Catholic dialogue held July 7, 2016, organized by USCCB, overseen by the (Vatican's) Pontifical Council for Inter-Religious Dialogue. The objective of these annual sessions is to examine Hindu and Catholic traditions and promote dialogue and understanding. The theme for this year was "Theological Reasons for Mutual Respect and Reverence." The sessions are co-sponsored by the Secretariat for Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs at the USCCB.
- 6. Statue of Our Lady of Good Health, Vailankanni at the Lourdes Grotto IACA is planning to erect a statue of Our Lady of Good Health, Vailankanni at the National Shrine Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes in Emmitsburg, MD. At the December 2014 Annual General Body meeting, a resolution was passed to approve the installation of the Vailankanni statue at the Grotto Shrine. The IACA Executive Committee (EC) has been in communication with the Grotto Director and a spot close to the main entrance has been designated for the statue. The EC is currently working on the feasibility and the costs of this project. Soon after the annual Pilgrimage, IACA will establish a separate committee to oversee this project.


#### IACA Membership:

Dear IACA Supporter,

As you know, IACA is a charitable, non-profit organization run by volunteers and all costs including the cost for holding the annual Pilgrimage are covered by the generous donations from people like you. We are blessed to have hundreds of Catholics of South Asian origin from all over the country participate in our Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Good Health, Vailankanni. This year we hope and pray that you can join us at the Basilica on September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

The costs to conduct the annual Pilgrimage amount to approximately \$10,000. Besides paying a stipend to the main celebrant, the concelebrants, and Basilica staff, we have to cater the reception for the pilgrims and pay the hall rental and insurance, in addition to several other miscellaneous expenses like printing and mailing this newsletter. We also pay a stipend to the priests who celebrate the monthly Novena Mass at the Shrine and at the annual Mother's Day pilgrimage. IACA's operating costs are paid for by your generous donations and the annual membership fees; which are only \$20 per family.

To run this Association it takes many hands and financial help. We rely on your support both as a volunteer and as a donor. Please note that the offertory money collected during the Pilgrimage Mass and the monthly Novena Mass goes to the Basilica and not to IACA. Also, all offerings made at the Oratory of Our Lady of Good Health, Vailankanni in the Crypt Church are retained by the Basilica.
